Hello,

I'm writing to add my concerns to the growing list of concerns from other residents in the San Mateo Woods community. Please see the issues noted and sample pictures attached below.

**1) Parking Issues**

The public parking on Clearview Way and Bayridge Way is now filled with mostly employee parked cars from Go-Pro and Solar City during business hours and early evening. Their company logos and parking stickers can be seen displayed on many of the cars. Employees are choosing to park on our neighborhood streets instead of their designated parking areas. As a result, our residents and resident visitors are often unable to find nearby parking now.

**2) Traffic Issues**

There is additional traffic on Clearview during business hours with cars in search of parking as well as the foot traffic of employees walking up and down the street during business hours and early evening.

**3) Dangerous Safety Issues**

Multiple employees ride bikes, skate boards or razors down the street at high speeds (sometimes down the wrong side of the road facing oncoming traffic) to return to their cars after work.

**4) Safety and Privacy Concerns**

There are often parked cars with people sitting in them having their lunch or taking their breaks, as well as employees sitting in our private property park which has been clearly marked private property.



As we understand it, the city has also approved the building of additional office space in this area that already has a serious parking shortage. This will most certainly make the issues worse.
