

CILANTRO: Santo
Coriandrum sativum

Standard cilantro, slower-bolting than some.

- Direct sow, full sun
- Plant 1/4-1/2" deep, rows 3" apart
- No need to thin; grow well sown thickly
- 50-55 days to maturity
- Annual
- If allowed to flower, provides pollen and nectar for bees

BASIL: Dolly
Ocimum basilicum

Compact yet full plants; high-yielding Genovese basil.

- Full sun; will tolerate some shade
- Direct sow into ground
- Plant 1/4" deep, 2-3 seeds per ", rows 18" apart
- Plant height 16-18"
- 70 days to maturity
- Annual

DILL: Bouquet
Anethum graveolens

Foliage is "dill weed". Flowers are also edible and can be used as garnish and in pickling.

- Full sun
- Plant in cool season, direct sow, in sun
- Plant 1/8-1/4" deep, 1/4-1/2" apart, rows 3" apart
- 40-45 days to leaf harvest
- Annual

THYME: German Winter
Thymus vulgaris

Winter-hardy thyme, good flavor and yield.

- Full to partial sun
- Start seeds inside, transplant when seeds have 4 true leaves
- Plant seedlings 6-8" apart, rows 12" apart
- 90-95 days to maturity
- Perennial

PARSLEY: Flat leaf
Petroselinum crispum

Robust flavor, attracts pollinators. Pick as needed.

- Full sun to part shade
- Plant in cool season, direct sow
- Plant 1/4" deep, 3 seeds per 8", rows 16" apart
Thin when 1" tall to space 8" apart.
- 70-90 days to maturity
- Biennial

CHAMOMILE: German
Matricaria recutita

Flowers can be steeped for tea, dried for floral arrangements, or edible petals used in salads.
Attracts beneficial insects and pollinators.

- Full sun
- Direct sow
- Press a pinch of seeds into soil every 8", rows 18" apart
- 60-65 days to maturity
- Annual
