

LIZARD TAIL, aka SEASIDE WOOLY SUNFLOWER
Eriophyllum staechadifolium

Found in coastal environments; tolerates full sun, salt spray, wind, and drought. Silvery-green foliage.

- Direct sow
- Plant to the depth of each seed's widest part; 15-30 days to germinate
- 1-5 feet tall depending on conditions, ave. 4 ft.
- Perennial




POLLINATOR CONSERVATION MIX

Xerces Society mix including yarrow, Clarkia, California poppy, dense flowered lupine, Grindelia, and more; a mix of colorful, sun-loving California natives that are annuals and perennials.

- Full sun




CLARKIA: MOUNTAIN GARLAND
Clarkia unguiculata

Tallest of the clarkias, in shades of bright pink, purple, and lavender. Blooms early to midsummer. Nectar source for moths. Long-lasting as a cut flower.

- Sun; tolerates part shade
- Direct sow after last frost. Sow near surface as seeds need light to germinate.
- Plant in groups and thin to 9" apart
- Plant height 2-3 feet

GILIA: GLOBE
Gilia capitata

Hardy annual, globe-shaped clusters of blue to violet flowers. Prefers hot and dry conditions. Long blooming season. Can self-sow.

- Full/partial sun
- Direct sow into ground
- Plant just below surface, 12" apart
- Plant height 1-3 feet

CLARKIA: FAREWELL TO SPRING

Clarkia amoena

Crimson to mauve to pink-colored cup-shaped flowers, can bloom for 3-4 months, and may self-sow.

- Full sun to part shade
- Direct sow after last frost. Sow near surface as seeds need light to germinate.
- Plant height ave. 3 feet

EVENING PRIMROSE

Oenothera hookeri

Bright yellow 3" flowers; open in afternoon. Long bloom season is great for hummingbirds. Self-sows.

- Full sun
- Direct sow just under soil, after germination thin to rows 12" apart
- Plant height 2-6 feet

CALIFORNIA GOLDFIELDS

Lasthenia californica

Small, daisy-like annual with clusters of yellow flowers. Early bloomer, usually in March.

- Full sun
- Direct sow just under soil
- Thin seedlings if crowded
- Plant height 3-16"

HAYFIELD TARWEED

Hemizonia congesta ssp. letescens

Daisy-like yellow annual flower; blooms later in summer (after California Goldfields have finished blooming). Provides nectar and pollen. Drought-tolerant. Seeds were a food source for indigenous peoples.

- Full sun
- Direct sow just under surface of soil
- Plant height 4-30"

CALIFORNIA BUCKWHEAT

Eriogonum fasciculatum

Mounding plant with leathery deep green leaves and wooly undersides; blooms are white and pink pom-poms from April to September and turn rust colored into fall.

- Full sun
- Direct sow in fall or winter, or sow in flats
- Plant height 1-6.6 feet
- Supports many pollinators!

DUNE TANSY

Tanacetum camphoratum

Rhizomatous plant with silvery leaves and yellow disc flowers. Bay Area native that is increasingly rare due to habitat loss. Does well in coastal soil and can be used as ground cover.

- Full sun
- Direct sow in fall or spring, or sow in flats
- Plant height 1-2 feet
- Perennial

SEA THRIFT

Armeria maritima

Pink flowers on 8-inch stalks. Does well in saline soil.

- Full sun or part shade
- Direct sow in fall or spring, or sow in flats
- Plant height under 1 foot
- Perennial

CALIFORNIA SHADY WILDFLOWER MIX

Beautiful adaptable mix that can thrive in party shade, filtered light, or half-day sun. Includes several types of Clarkia, Baby Blue Eyes, Five Spot, Chinese Houses, Grand Linanthus, and Birds' Eye Gilia.

- Direct sow October through February

GOLDEN STATE NATIVE GRASS EROSION MIX

Three fast-growing, native, perennial bunch grasses: blue wildrye, California brome, and California meadow barley. Good cover for erosion control on slopes, or planted among native grasses that are slower-growing.

- Blue wildrye: up to 5 feet
- California brome: 1-4 feet
- California meadow barley: 1.5-3.5 feet

RED STICKY MONKEYFLOWER

Mimulus aurantiacus var. puniceus

Showy red to orange trumpet-shaped flowers with slightly sticky leaves. Flower nectar is a food source for hummingbirds.

- Full sun to part shade
- Sow near surface as seeds need light to germinate
- Plant height ave. 2 feet
- Annual

SAGE: BLAZE OF FIRE*Salvia splendens*

Scarlet blooms are food for bees and other pollinators. Great for containers or flower beds.

- Full sun
- Direct sow in spring
- Plant 1/16" deep, 18" apart
- Plant height .5-1 foot
- 75 days to maturity
- Perennial

**SAGE: BLUE***Salvia azurea*

Azure-colored blooms are a food source for bees and butterflies. Drought-tolerant.

- Full sun
- Direct sow in spring
- Plant 1/16 inch deep, 18" apart
- Plant height ave. 3 feet
- 125 days to maturity
- Perennial

**COSMOS, Wild, Sensation Mix***Cosmos bipinnatus*

Colorful flowers, hardy, versatile variety that thrives in varied climates. Attracts bees and other pollinators. Drought-tolerant.

- Full sun; direct sow in spring
- Plant 1/4" deep, 9-12" apart
- Plant height ave. 5 feet
- 60-90 days to maturity
- Annual

**CORNFLOWER: Tall Blue Boy***Centaurea cyanus*

Deep blue cornflower; edible petals. Aka "Bachelor Buttons".

- Full sun, direct sow
- Plant 1/4" deep, 6 seeds/foot, thin to 6 ft apart
- Plant height ave. 3 feet
- 65-75 days to maturity
- Annual, self-seeding
